Tracked Actions: What are they?

- They are an important way to keep the project focused on SC guidance
 - And in the future, Task Team Guidance
- During the SC-1 meeting in 2017, 45 were created
 - They were then reviewed and edited
 - Approved by the SC members
 - Most specifically their owners
 - Reviewed periodically for status



Tracked Actions: Definitions and Status Summary

Definition of Terms:

- Completed: Work done very close to how it is described – may warrant a next step
- Closed: Work done mostly in spirit – may warrant a next step or edit to remain relevant
- Revise: This may mean a slight rewrite to remain relevant or be a follow-on to previous Action
- In process: Not yet closed -or- may have become an ongoing activity

Tracked Actions: ...of those Completed & Closed

25 will have no further action taken as they are completed

- Much of this is associated with:
 - Work done on Terms of References and defining DOOS
 - Work done by the Task Teams to articulate EOVs and work with GOOS
 - Work done on communications such as the website and the SIG
 - Work done to brief DOOS at conferences, meetings, and community dialog (the CWP)



Tracked Actions: ...of those up for Revision

20 have the potential for further action or revision

Much of this is associated with:

- Integration with the observing community beyond GOOS and the EOVS Panels – here we mean the large networks and observatories and capacity development
 - Much of the work to be done related to these items will be completed during the AccelNet and Demonstration Project activities
 - Partners may include large networks, observatories, and sustained observing projects
- Working on integration of DOOS requirements and lessons learned into policy and stewardship groups and activities
 - Much of this work will be done with concerted Engagement related to the UN Decade
 - Partners may include coordination and policy development groups



Tracked Actions: Guidance on Identifying New Actions Today

- Cross disciplinary opportunities for demonstration of the importance of sustained deep-sea observations
- Ways to interface with existing observing networks, infrastructures, and projects to help mature technologies
- Ways to highlight data advances and demonstrate FAIR principles utilizing deep-sea data
- Articulate clear needs for DOOS engagement and partnerships
